

Housing - Frequently Asked Questions

Alcohol, Tobacco and Illegal Substances

Are alcohol, smoking, or vaping permitted on campus? No. Alcohol, tobacco, vaping products, and any types of recreational drugs/illegal substances are not permitted anywhere on campus, either outside or inside any building (including campus suites).

Appliances

What appliances are allowed? Coffee makers, blenders, crock pots, microwaves and toaster ovens may be brought; however, deep fryers and hot plates may not be used. To avoid potential safety hazards, all electrical appliances should be no more than 1000 watts, must have “UL” approval and be properly maintained. All appliances are to be used in on-campus housing kitchen areas; no appliances (crockpots, coffee makers, etc.) are permitted in other campus facilities.

Elevators

Are elevators available in the on-campus housing? There are no elevators, only stairs to 2nd floor suites.

Housing Registration

Kitchen and Paper Supplies

Do I need to bring kitchen supplies? You will need to provide your own dishes, utensils, paper products, cutlery, etc. Trash bags and toilet paper will be provided by the university.

Laundry

Are laundry facilities available? Yes, laundry facilities are accessible and do not require quarters to operate. You will need to provide your own detergent, fabric softener, iron, ironing board, etc.

Linens & Bedding

What linens do I need to bring if I am staying on campus? No linens are provided. You will need to supply all sheets (extra-long twin size), blankets, pillows, towels, etc. Additionally, if more than 4 people are staying in your suite, you will also need to provide any air mattresses, other padding or cots desired for those who will not be sleeping on beds.

Occupancy Limits

How many people are allowed to stay in a suite?

- Two-bathroom suites have 4 twin beds and can house a maximum of 10 people.
- One-bathroom suites have 4 twin beds and can house a maximum of 8 people.
- Handicap-Accessible suites have 3 twins and can house a maximum of 6 people.

Who can room together in a suite?

ALL occupants of a suite must meet one of the two following criteria: **ALL** must be members of the **same family or ALL** must be of the **same gender**.

Pets

No pets are allowed.
